They need 72 bookbags, we've ordered 96 from Amazon, 250 erasers to put onto pencils, we've also ordered around 500 pencils & highlighters. We've ordered 1000 sheets of notebook paper.

All of this is being done from the kindness of our Brethren in our lodge.

On June 26th, I received a \$50.00 check from one of our Widows with a note to buy school supplies. We stay busy at Atkinson, no sooner than one project is completed, as we're working on another.






Oxford's Annual FLAGS Fund Raising Campaign
